**Program Description:** As an essential part of our broader resettlement efforts, the New Roots program enables refugees to celebrate their heritage and nourish themselves and their neighbors by planting strong roots—literally—in their new communities. New Roots in Phoenix promotes economic empowerment and food security for over 100 farmers, gardeners and refugees employed in agriculture. From their first job in agriculture to opening their own businesses, New Roots helps refugees on every step of their journey to convert their skills into prosperous businesses in the Valley.

**Volunteers can help New Roots in many different ways, including:**

- Building a shade or compost structure, bench, hoop house or produce processing station
- Help prepare rows and soil for planting
- Plant seedlings and help with other garden works
